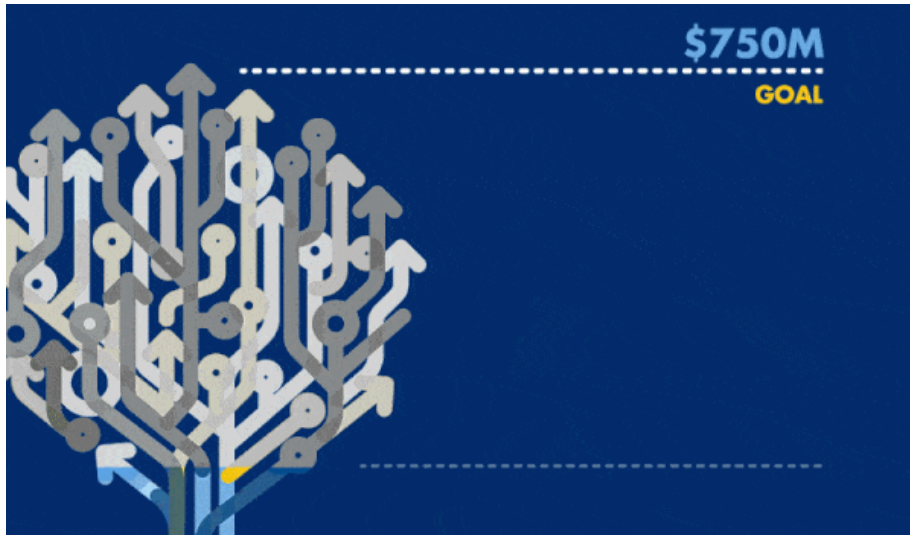

As of March 1, Drexel's alumni and other supporters had committed to investing more than \$685 million toward the Campaign's \$750 million fundraising goal, and more than 37,000 alumni had engaged with the
